Veteran's Day Memorial Hunt

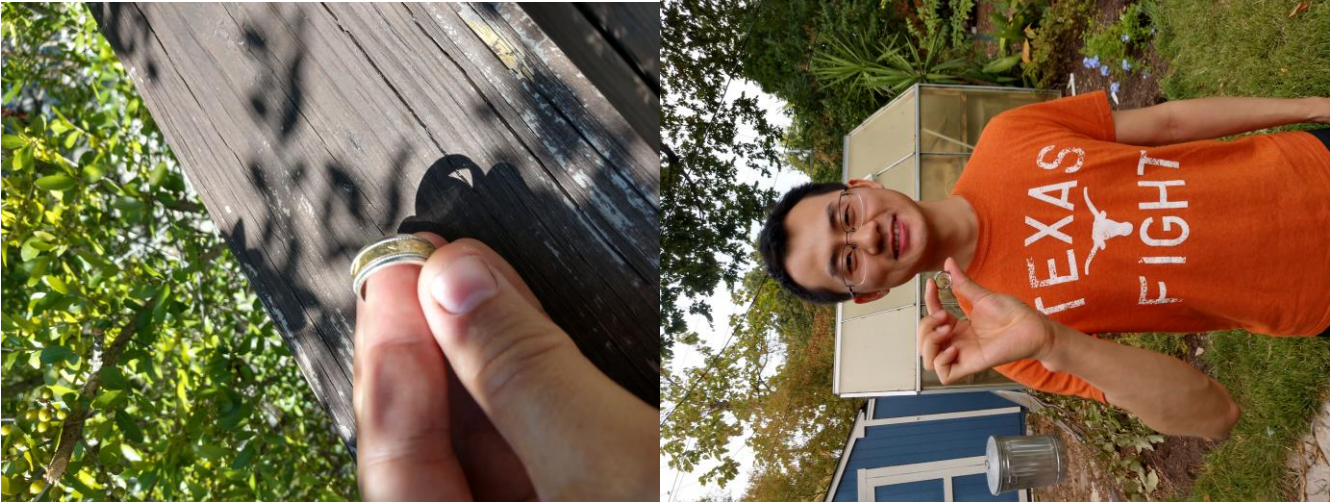
