Why is it that some people don't make resolutions? Are they afraid of failure, too much trouble etc.?

What are some reasons people often don't keep resolutions? Are they lazy, unmotivated?

To ensure more success, resolutions should be:

MEASURABLE - example; "get organized", is pretty ambiguous. Something like, "I will organize my family photos before the end of April" is defined and has time frame.

REALISTIC - do-able - example; "I will jog 3 times a day every day of the year", is not realistic. Something like "I will jog twice a week for a half hour" is more achievable.

NOT OVERWHELMING - **TOO MANY**: it is probably easier to meet a few resolutions than a whole slew of them. Be selective and begin with those that are most important to you.

REPEATING RESOLUTIONS - If the same Resolution(s) appear year after year and you don't meet it - try a different approach. It could possibly be that the resolution no longer fits your life goals. (example: for years my goal was to take piano lessons and learn how to play the piano, but year after year, it never happened.) This particular resolution/goal has been replaced with other interests and goals – i.e. metal detecting!
