### **My hunting tips in times of COVID – Submitted by Member Jan Hallez, Aurora CO.**

So, I'm getting quite dismayed over the lack of finds around here. Used to be the schools would have quite a few coins in the playgrounds, and around the school in the grass. The COVID arrived. While there are still children playing there after school hours, the number of finds has greatly diminished. The detectorists up here in Colorado have been invading "My territory!" The usual athletic fields are being picked clean.

I decided to return to the beginning, when my sister showed me about this sport. A few weeks ago, I dug out my old Mapsco Denver Regional Street Atlas. It shows all of the parks and schools in the Metro area. It also lists all the schools in the back, with addresses and phone numbers. This is very handy at this point to see if there are students in attendance. I have also called the schools to gain permission to hunt. Mapsco atlases are not available everywhere now. Got my first one at Sam's Club. Now I can only find them at our local AAA store. Using these, I make a written plan for detecting trips, making sure I cover all locations, and not skip a good field or school.

Scouting trips have been good as well. Taking pictures of soccer fields while in use, can direct you to where the crowds are sitting, or where the athletic bags are dumped. The most productive areas on these fields is where the snack shack is parked. More than one ring has been found this way!

And of course I am also into Geocaching. After signing up (free), you will have access to the maps online at [Geocaching.com](https://www.geocaching.com). Using this will take you to some really nice, and some old parks that are not hunted out. I always bring my caching equipment, along with a couple of detectors on these trips.

### THE LURE OF OLD COINS!

In this issue we will look at a wonderful coin – the Flying Eagle Cent! As a kid I was able to trade some baseball cards for two Flying Eagle Cents, and still have them today. What a treasure! Here is some interesting information from Wikipedia about these cents:

“The **Flying Eagle cent** is a one-cent piece struck by U.S. Mint as a pattern coin in 1856 and for circulation in 1857 and 1858. The coin was designed by Mint Chief Engraver James B. Longacre, with the eagle in flight based on the work of Longacre's predecessor, Christian Gobrecht.

By the early 1850s, the large cent (about the size of a half dollar) being issued by the Mint was becoming both unpopular in commerce and expensive to coin. After experimenting with various sizes and compositions, the Mint decided on an alloy of 88% copper and 12% nickel for a new, smaller cent. After the Mint produced patterns with an 1856 date and gave them to legislators and officials, Congress formally authorized the new piece in February 1857.

The new cent was issued in exchange for the worn Spanish colonial silver coin that had circulated in the U.S. until then, as well as for its larger predecessor. So many cents were issued that they choked commercial channels, especially as they were not legal tender and no one had to take them. The eagle design did not strike well, and was replaced in 1859 by Longacre's Indian Head cent.”
