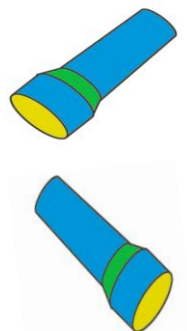
## MARCH PROGRAM

## FEBRUARY PROGRAM RECAP

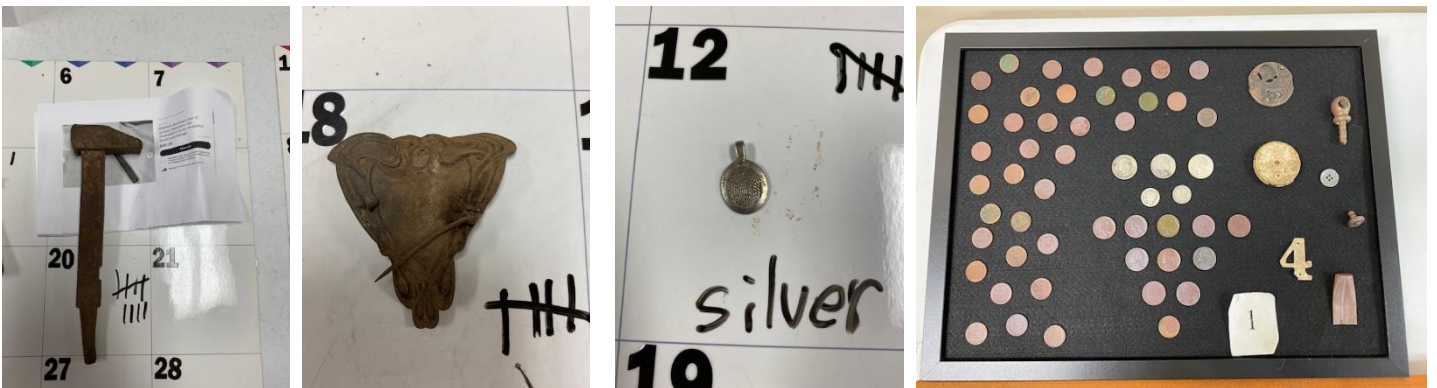

## HIDE AND SEEK

### THE LAST CACHE OF 2022 AND THE FIRST OF 2023

The last cache of 2022 was found by Ed Newsom on January 13, 2023. He found it in Camp Ben McCulloch, which is more than slightly appropriate as Ed hunts Camp Ben more often anyone else in the Club, without any doubt. He found it just a few feet in front of a huge Oak tree that also sported a natural cache hole. Ed was awarded an old silver dollar for his effort and success.



The first cache of 2023 was buried on February 9th. It contains several 'No Value' tokens so should not sound like trash. The first clue set was distributed at the regular Club meeting that evening.

The second clue set will be distributed at the March Members meeting and is more specific than the first. With a little research, you should be able to determine the general location (to within 2000 feet) of the cache.

When you find the cache, please notify the webmaster as soon as practical thereafter. He will then immediately post your name and the location where it was found on the website. Please bring the found cache to the next Members meeting to claim your prize and collect lots of oohs and ahhs!

## **FUTURE FUN HUNTS**

This month we have two fun hunts to talk about at the March Members meeting.

### **FIRST**

The first hunt will occur this Saturday, March 11th, at 9 AM. The location is the same as January's Fun Hunt. The street address of the property will only be divulged at the meeting, at the property owner's request.

If you've been coming to the Club meetings or reading the newsletters, you know that this site has produced some great finds including several FOM category winners. Whether you missed the January hunt or not, understand that this will probably be your last chance to search this site. As a bonus, we have been granted permission to search the adjacent 2.5 acre lot which had a home on it for at least 50 years and has never been hunted to our knowledge.

A signed 'Permission and Release' form is required for this hunt. Please do not enter the property except during the hunt times and dates – if you do, you are breaking the law.

### **SECOND**

The second fun hunt is located in far north Austin and is owned by the father of one of the Club's most successful detectorists. The site is over 21 acres of lightly vegetated land and has probably never been detected. It had a home (~1967-2003), a used car business (circa 1967) and a work shop (~1967-2022) on it according to Historic Aerials and Google Earth images. It shows evidence of being used before 1964, which is the oldest image published for the site.

This hunt will be held Saturday, April 8<sup>th</sup>, from 9 AM to 3 PM. The location of this hunt will also be announced at the March meeting, it will not be published.

A signed 'Permission and Release' form is required for this hunt. Please do not enter the property except during the hunt times and dates – if you do, you are breaking the law.

Both the form and its instructions are part of this newsletter, as well as the Resource page of the Club website.

## **PERMISSION AND RELEASE FORM INSTRUCTIONS**

The form is printed with two copies on one full sheet of paper. One copy is for the property owner and one copy is for the hunter. Do not cut the sheet in half.

Each form (half-page) has two sections - the upper half will be completed by the property owner and the bottom half by the detectorist.

The detectorist should complete and sign the lower sections of *\*both\** forms before arriving at the hunt location. It should be given to the huntmaster as you enter the hunt site.

During the hunt, or as soon as practical thereafter, the property owner will complete and sign their portions of the forms. The sheets will be cut in half with one half being kept by the property owner and the other given to the detectorist.
